Remembering the Husky who balanced the federal budget

It is with a heavy heart that we received the sad news that Charlie, Charles J. Zwick, died on Friday, April 20, 2018.

Charlie received his bachelor's degree and master's degree in Agricultural Economics at UConn. Later, he

earned his doctorate in economics from Harvard University while serving as an economics instructor, and then the Rand. Corp., the government, and the private sector.

He has the distinction of being the only director of the U.S. Bureau of the Budget under President Lyndon Johnson to balance the federal budget until the Clinton Administration.

Charlie established the Zwick Center for Food and Resource Policy in October 2010 through a \$1 million donation, later extended by \$500,000 in 2015.



Postdoctoral fellow Recognized for SNAP myth debunk

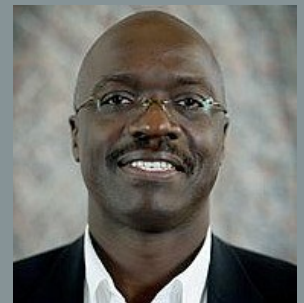


Shaheer Burney, who is a postdoctoral fellow in the Zwick Center for Food and Resource Policy, published provocative new findings on the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program in the high-impact journal *Food Policy*. UConn Today publication wrote a story on Burney and his findings regarding the SNAP that seemed to disprove a negative perception held among many: that the program pushes members away from healthy eating habits.

"SNAP is doing what we are hoping it will do, which is improving food security and increasing expenditures on meals prepared at home and farmer's markets rather than food from [fast-food] restaurants [and vending machines]" says Burney. Other work is being conducted at Zwick by postdoc Rebecca Boehm on the diet quality consequences of climate change and the impact of healthcare access on the diet of the poor.
