In Memory of Prof. Emilio Pagoulatos

Emilio Pagoulatos, 1947-2018, served as The ARE Department Head from 1987—2007. Emilio amassed an amazing quantity and breadth of scholarly research in areas including international trade and development, international agricultural trade, economic growth and development, and the intersection of international trade and domestic market power.



ARE Rankings Attest to National Prominence

The ARE faculty was ranked in the top five nationally by the latest metrics of Academic Analytics, which adjusts for size (full-time equivalent in research). Research productivity has been ranked in the top 20 worldwide among agricultural economics departments by Ideas/REPEC, based on citations but without adjusting for size. The department currently has 14 faculty (11 tenure-track and 3 non-tenure track), 115 undergraduate majors, as well as 47 graduate students (15 M.S. and 32 Ph.D). Currently, the Department is searching for a new head for Fall 2019, to take it to the next level.
